WHAT INSPIRED YOU TO WORK IN YOUR FIELD OF EXPERTISE?

Growing up in rural Georgia, in a family of civic and business leaders, I always knew I would do something to support my fellow Americans. Working in national security allows me to do that while serving my country and advocating for America's values and principles globally.

ONE TIP YOU WOULD GIVE WOMEN WHO ASPIRE TO BE IN LEADERSHIP ROLES?

I would say expand your horizons, even if it means taking a risk on something new. For instance, I am always encouraging women to get involved in some of the biggest global issues of the day by looking at careers in national security. I think a lot of women—especially minority women—do not realize that some of these opportunities exist for us. When I was asked to serve at the State Department, by not limiting myself to a traditional position, I was able to utilize my unique professional experiences and skillsets to create a focus on subnational diplomacy. I want all women to give themselves the room to be open to new opportunities and not shy away from taking risks.

YOUR ADVICE TO OTHERS ON HOW THEY MAY BE SUCCESSFUL IN THEIR CAREER?

Once you are given an opportunity, make sure that you do not limit yourself and that you use it to its fullest extent. Always think creatively and be open to opportunity.
