*Event Synopsis:* The Executive Women in Government (EWG) Leadership Summit will feature unique educational, mentoring, and networking opportunities. The Summit will focus on Leading with Purpose. This theme emphasizes the importance of having a clear sense of purpose and vision in leadership. It will encourage women to identify and pursue their passions and goals, and to lead with authenticity, integrity, and a commitment to making a positive impact.

The focus of the Summit is professional development, emphasizing small group formats across 3 "tracks", so that participants can engage with session leads and each other.

- Track 2 will feature sessions where attendees can hear from senior executive women in a variety of career areas *Communications, Counterterrorism/Diplomacy, Cyber, Defense, Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion, Finance, Innovation, Information Technology, Law Enforcement, Privacy, Public Health, and Science;* and
- Track 3 will feature cross-cutting leadership topics.

Summit participants will have the opportunity to select from any track to attend each hour so as to make full use of the extensive resources provided.
