Barbara Hackman Franklin served as the 29th U.S. Secretary of Commerce for President George H.W. Bush. A notable achievement was her mission to China in 1992 which brought back \$1 billion in signed contracts for American companies. In 2017 *TIME Magazine* named her one of the "50 Women who Made American Political History."

Currently Franklin is President and CEO of Barbara Franklin Enterprises, an international consulting firm headquartered in Washington, DC.

In 1971 Franklin led the first White House effort to recruit women for high-level government jobs as staff assistant to President Richard Nixon, an effort which resulted in nearly quadrupling the number of women in those positions. Her story is told in the book *A Matter of Simple Justice: The Untold Story of Barbara Hackman Franklin and A Few Good Women* by Lee Stout. Following this, the President appointed her as an original Commissioner of the U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission where she focused on safety for children. Altogether Franklin has served five U.S. Presidents. In 2006 she received the Woodrow Wilson Award for Public Service and in 2023 was inducted into the Government Hall of Fame.

Franklin has twice founded her own business and has served for over 30 years as a director of 14 public companies, 3 private companies and many not-for-profit organizations. She was a founder of Executive Women in Government. Franklin is currently vice chair of the board of the National Museum of American History, a board member of the National Symphony Orchestra, the National Committee on US-China Relations, and a trustee of the George and Barbara Bush Foundation. She is chair emerita of both the Economic Club of New York and the National Association of Corporate Directors. She graduated with distinction from the Pennsylvania State University and was one of the first women graduates of Harvard Business School.
